PREFACE

According to the California Outdoor Recreation Plan (2002), a publication updated every five years by the California Department of Parks and Recreation, use of the State's public park and recreation areas is heavy and continues to increase. After the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001, Californians have generally opted to vacation closer to home, traveling more within the State, and visiting State and national parks located in California.

That report documents a high demand for traditional outdoor recreation which does not require a lot of money or equipment, such as walking, visiting historical sites, driving for pleasure, picnicking, hiking, general nature and wildlife study, camping at developed sites, and bicycling. Of particular interest is the steadily increasing popularity of nature study in particular, particularly among two large and growing demographic groups – Hispanics and seniors. According to the report, Californians continue to partake in adventure and high-risk activities such as windsurfing and kayaking. Finally, the report documents a steady decline in hunting and fishing activities, particularly among younger citizens. According to the report, some of the top five factors that influence Californians' choices in which recreational activities they undertake include: the opportunity to be outdoors; enjoying the beauty; and the quality of the natural setting.

This information is important when viewed in context of the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta, because the Delta is teeming with opportunities for wildlife observation and study, historical points of interest and walking tours, and traditional fishing and hunting opportunities, and it contains numerous areas of scenic natural beauty. In addition, two of the Counties that make up the Delta – Contra Costa and Sacramento – are among eight of California's 58 counties that have population densities greater than 1,000 persons per square mile. Increasing populations in the rapidly-growing urban areas within these Counties will demand more nature-based recreational and educational opportunities, and will continue to seek these opportunities in the Delta.

There have been a few changes to the inventory since it was first completed in 1997. In many cases, the names of facilities have changed due to new ownership, or the facilities are no longer in business. This version of the inventory also corrects errors and adds facilities that were omitted from the 1997 inventory. Finally, there have been expansions at some of the recreational facilities included in the original inventory; the most common expansions at marinas over the past eight years have been the addition of dry boat storage areas, RV spaces, pumpout facilities, and modification of docks and slips to accommodate larger boats.

Some new public recreational facilities have been constructed in the Delta since 1997. The Cities of Sacramento, West Sacramento, and Stockton have constructed pedestrian promenades along their respective waterfront areas, and the City of Isleton and Delta community of Walnut Grove have both constructed public docks along their waterfronts providing the boating public access to attractions in town. Also, Sacramento County

provided numerous improvements for windsurfers at its property located on the tip of Sherman Island, and the Department of Parks and Recreation expanded its holdings at Delta Meadows River Park by acquiring 300 acres behind Locke. East Bay Regional Parks District increased its presence in the Delta with its Big Break Regional Shoreline; a fishing pier, restrooms, picnicking areas, and trails are currently under construction, and there are plans for development of a Delta Science Center at Big Break, as well.

Background Information on the Delta Protection Commission, the Delta, and Previous Recreation Reports

The Delta Protection Commission was formed as a result of State legislation passed in 1992. The legislation states "the delta's waterways and marinas [and] recreational boating within the delta is of statewide and local significance and is a source of economic benefit to the region..." (Public Resources Code Section 29712).

The Commission was charged with developing a "comprehensive long-term resource management plan for land uses within the primary zone of the delta" including "preserve and protect open-space and outdoor recreation opportunities" and "preserve and protect opportunities for controlled public access and use of public lands and waterways consistent with the protection of natural resources and private property interests" and "preserve, protect, and maintain navigation".

The Commission prepared a series of background reports, including one on recreation and access, which noted a lack of current data on recreational uses of the Delta Primary Zone. The Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways entered into a contract with the Department of Parks and Recreation to prepare a user survey [see Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta Recreation Survey, August 1997]. In addition, the Commission's staff was directed to prepare a survey of recreational facilities in the Delta, focusing on the Primary Zone. This survey of recreational facilities was originally completed in November 1997, and is now being updated.

This updated survey of Delta recreation facilities does not adequately describe the scope and extent of recreation uses in the Delta, because those facilities serve many individuals who come from outside of the Delta to use the Delta waterways. For example, the number and location of launch ramps does not adequately indicate the number of users of the waterways, nor does it adequately describe the economic costs and benefits of recreationalists in the Delta.

The Delta is part of an extensive area of waterways that begins just east of San Francisco Bay and stretches north and south along the rivers in the Delta watershed; primarily the Sacramento and San Joaquin Rivers. Within the Legal Delta (as defined in State Water Code, Section 12220), water covers approximately 61,000 acres of the 738,493 acres; the Delta Primary Zone contains 51,000 acres of water-covered area within the total 491,774 acre area (Department of Water Resources, Report on Land Use Patterns in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta, 1993).

As of the 2000 Census, the regional population for the Bay Area is approximately 6.8 million with another 2.15 million persons in Sacramento, San Joaquin, and Yolo Counties. This creates a pool of nearly 9.0 million persons of potential recreationalists within a reasonable travel distance of the Delta, up from 8.5 million ten years ago. While the updated inventory of marinas in the Legal Delta indicates that there are nearly 12,000 berths, the number of registered recreational vessels in the nine Bay Area counties and the Delta counties total over 258,000 (Department of Motor Vehicles, Total Vessel Registration by County as of December 31, 2003); which is almost 27% of vessels registered Statewide. Sacramento and San Joaquin Counties alone have 77,660 registered vessels including anything from a large sailing vessel to a personal watercraft (aka jet ski).

Statewide, of the 959,849 vessels registered with Department of Motor Vehicles, more than half are less than 16 feet in length. Many of those small vessels are “jet” propelled; some are outboards. These vessels are often stored at home – in driveways and garages throughout the region – and launched into Delta waterways for day use.

Vessels of varying sizes are stored in the hundreds of dry storage spaces located in and around the Delta region. The original 1997 Inventory noted that many marinas provide dry storage spaces (more than 15 in the Delta area are listed in the 2003 Cal/North Directory), but there are at least as many dry land storage facilities located in and around the Delta region, particularly in urban areas (at least another 20 facilities surrounding the Delta are listed in the 2003 Cal/North Directory). Many of the changes to marinas that have been tracked since 1997 have involved the addition of dry boat storage areas; several new dry boat and/or RV storage facilities have also been constructed in the Delta area since completion of the original Inventory.

In addition to the large number of people served by the recreational opportunities in the Delta, there is a large economic benefit to the region and the State as a whole. A 1998 report prepared for the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways by the Department of Agricultural and Resource Economics at U.C. Berkeley, utilizing data developed by the Delta Recreational User Survey (August 1997), estimated gross receipts in the Delta of over \$247 million annually by boaters, and over \$186 million by anglers. These two groups impact spending on other industries, such as groceries, restaurants, gas stations and drugstores, in connection with their boating and fishing activities; this is reflected in the numbers. When a multiplier was incorporated into the model to account for actual expenditures plus value-added dollars in the Delta, the estimated figures rose to over \$444 million for boaters and over \$336 million for anglers. Because these two groups are not necessarily mutually exclusive (i.e., anglers are most often fishing from boats), the estimate on expenditures in the Delta by boaters and anglers alone, including the purchase of ancillary supplies and services, probably falls within the range of \$440 million to \$780 million annually. In addition, there is some information on Statewide benefits of recreation and associated services and amenities, which is relevant because people who recreate in the Delta are not limited to those who live near the Delta. A 1997 report prepared for the Department of Boating and Waterways (DBW) indicated gross receipts statewide of over \$28 million from dry

storage; \$178 million from marinas (wet storage); \$123 million from launching fees; almost \$11 million from marina service stations; \$1.1 billion from boat dealers; and \$78 million from personal watercraft dealers. The 1995 expenditures in these non-boating industries by boaters statewide totaled \$1.3 billion. Lastly, the 1997 DBW report looked at taxes generated by the boating industry; including state taxes generated (personal and corporate income taxes, gasoline taxes, and boat licenses and fees); local property taxes (boats, marinas, and other boating businesses); and other local revenues (sales tax and business licenses). For the entire State, those revenues were over \$588 million in 1995.

Recreational facilities in the Delta should be evaluated along with the survey of users prepared by the Department of Parks and Recreation for the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways.

A new study, the Delta Boating Needs Assessment (DBNA), was released by the Department of Boating and Waterways in 2002. This document evaluated the supply and demand of recreational amenities available to boaters in the Delta, utilizing the 1997 user survey, original 1997 facilities inventory, and new information, and summarized Delta recreational facilities' needs to accommodate the growing population's recreational boating needs through the year 2020. According to the DBNA, boater visitation to the Delta will increase by 25 percent to more than 8 million visitor days (up from 6.4 million visitor days) between 2000 and 2020. Based on population projections and boater needs, the DBNA predicts a shortage of berths, launch ramp lanes, parking spaces, transient tie-ups, restrooms, day-use picnicking areas, fueling facilities, and dry boat storage spaces.

The inventory of facilities was intended to gather into one document information about public and private facilities which provide recreational opportunities in the Delta area which takes advantage of the unique Delta resources, particularly the waters of the Delta. The inventory of recreational facilities is not intended to be a guidebook, merely a resource for private and public planners, and the general public interested in what types of recreation facilities are located in the Delta. The inventory does include information about how to obtain specific information about the recreation facilities listed in the inventory.

INTRODUCTION

Background

In May of 1995, the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways entered into an agreement with the Department of Parks and Recreation to study recreation uses of the Delta, focusing on boating and fishing. Department of Water Resources contributed in-kind services and staff hours. The purpose of the study is to provide current recreational use figures for the entire Legal Delta for use by the Commission and by other federal, State, regional and local agencies in their planning processes.

For the original version of this inventory completed in 1997, a Recreation Oversight Subcommittee was appointed by the Commission. As part of the overall work program prepared by the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Delta Protection Commission staff prepared an inventory of Delta recreational facilities. The task was described as "identify and inventory existing recreation facilities and other recreation opportunities...identify and document current recreation opportunities in the Delta: inventory and map existing parks, fishing access locations, and other public recreation lands/facilities; inventory and map hunting clubs, yachting clubs, and other private recreational opportunities; inventory and map private property used for informal recreation; and inventory significant historical and cultural resources." The inventory focuses on sites in the Delta Primary Zone and Secondary Zones, with some sites included adjacent to the boundary of the Legal Delta, where those sites take advantage of the waterways and resources of the Primary Zone. The Recreation Oversight Subcommittee met several times to review the questionnaires and help oversee the user survey process, and to review the survey results.

The CALFED Bay-Delta Program initiated its planning process in the early 1990s to resolve Delta resource management issues and end conflicts among the Statewide users of the Delta's resources. At that time, several recreational interests from the Delta and the State were concerned that the CALFED program was not doing enough to address potential benefits and/or impacts to recreation from its program. At the urging of then-CALFED Director Lester Snow, the Delta Protection Commission and the Department of Boating and Waterways convened an Ad Hoc Recreation Committee, which submitted comments on specific components of the CALFED Program. CALFED adopted its Record of Decision (ROD) in 2000; the ROD includes numerous mitigation measures and commitments associated with recreation in the Delta and other parts of the State where the program is being implemented. To help plan for recreation Deltawide, in May 2001, the Delta Protection Commission appointed a new Recreation Citizens Advisory Committee, which included members of the Ad Hoc Recreation Committee, and invited all CALFED agencies to participate, as well as all local governments in the Delta area.

One of the commitments in the response to comments on the draft environmental document was assistance in preparing and funding a Delta Recreation Master Plan. Unfortunately, due to budget cutbacks, the CALFED Program has been able to provide the funds for the Delta Recreation Master Plan. Staff of the Commission opted instead to

apply for grant funding for preparation of the Delta Recreation Master Plan, with assistance and regular review being conducted by the Commission's Recreation Citizens Advisory Committee. In 2004, the Commission was successful at obtaining a grant from the Department of Boating and Waterways to address portions of the Delta Recreation Master Plan that deal with water-based recreation; staff is hoping to obtain additional grant funding in the future to complete land-based recreational amenities in the Delta.

Preparation of Inventory

The original inventory was prepared by gathering and reviewing a number of written sources, and verified through a visit to each site. The site visits were completed in October of 1995. Each site has an inventory sheet and each site was mapped on USGS quad maps of the Delta. The information was gathered using numerous sources including marina listings, magazines, guidebooks, maps, local planning reports and documents, newspaper articles, and other sources (see references).

This update of the Delta Protection Commission's 1997 inventory involved reviewing the individual inventory sheets used in the 1997 inventory, gathering updated information from numerous sources in print and on the Internet to update the information on those sheets, and conducting site visits over the summer and fall of 2004. Once the inventory sheets were updated with the new information, they were mailed out to the individual public and private recreation providers for verification; Commission staff followed up with these providers through phone and/or e-mail contact.

All of the Delta recreation sites in the 1997 inventory were mapped in the Commission's Geographic Information System data layers prepared by Teale Data Center, the Commission's mapping consultant at that time. For this update, all of the new information has been added to the recreation maps. The updated maps are also available on the Commission's website, www.delta.ca.gov.

One notable change from the 1997 Inventory is the inclusion of numerous wineries and vineyards that provide the public with additional opportunities for leisurely travel in the Delta. Since the 1997 Inventory was published, vineyards in the Delta have become a major supplier of the wine grapes used by major wine makers in Northern California, and Delta wines have also begun making a name for themselves. There are two places in the Delta area in which this advancement in wine grapes and Delta wines is particularly prominent: the Woodbridge area near Lodi (outside of the Delta), and the Clarksburg area in Yolo County (in the Delta Primary Zone), which has its own appellation.

This updated version of the 1997 inventory also contains information on facilities that provide products and services that are complementary to the recreation activities that occur in the Delta, including bait shops and dry boat storage areas.

Presentation of the Inventory

The information in the inventory is presented two ways: County by County, and by Type of Recreational Facility. In each presentation the information is presented three ways. First, there is a written description of the facilities, followed by a chart of the inventory

information, and, finally, a map illustrating the geographic distribution of the recreational facilities.

The numbering system is organized by County: Solano County begins with #1; Yolo County begins with #50; Sacramento County begins with #100; San Joaquin County begins with #200; and Contra Costa County begins with #300.

The charts presenting County-by-County information are organized by type of facility starting with marinas, and followed by launch ramps, yacht clubs, fishing access, parks, preserves, and, lastly, other types of facilities.

The charts presenting facilities by type are organized by County starting with Solano County, followed by Yolo, Sacramento, San Joaquin, and Contra Costa Counties.

A list of maps, Internet sites, booklets, and books prepared for use by the general public is included at the end of the report. The price and information on where to obtain this information is also included.

The area included in both the original and this updated Inventory included the Delta Primary and Secondary Zones, as well as areas adjacent to the Legal Delta that provide recreational users access to its natural resources.

DESCRIPTION OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES BY COUNTY

Solano County

Solano County's Delta lands lie on the western edge of the Legal Delta covering about 86,000 acres, or approximately 17 percent of the Primary Zone. The land includes property to the east and the west of the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, and to the west of the western levee of the Yolo Bypass. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: Hastings Tract, Prospect Island, and Ryer Island. Waterways in the County include Barker Slough, Cache Slough, Hastings Cut, Hoss Slough, Lindsey Slough, Sacramento River, and the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel. The City of Rio Vista is largely outside the Legal Delta, with a small area in the Primary Zone.

Since late 1997, when the original Inventory was published, there have been few changes to any recreational facilities in Solano County. Solano Land Trust's Jepsen Prairie Preserve, which has seasonal self-guided nature trail and weekend tours, added a shaded picnic area and portable toilet to its property, and Arrowhead Marina added a number of berths in accordance with a permit authorizing up to 156 berths.

Solano County has four marinas, all privately owned. Three of the marinas qualify as "medium" marinas and the fourth is a "large" marina. Arrowhead Harbor, on Prospect Island by Miner Slough, has 84 berths and is a "medium" marina (between 50 to 200 berths). Arrowhead also has a launch ramp, camping, and picnic facilities. Snug Harbor Resort on Ryer Island by Steamboat Slough is another "medium" marina with 115 berths, a launch ramp, 74 camping sites and 17 "Snuggle Inn" cabins available for rent, picnicking facilities, a fishing pier, and a small store that sells bait and groceries. Hidden Harbor Marina, a "medium" marina with 103 berths, generally rents its berths only to sailboats. Hidden Harbor is located at the confluence of Cache and Steamboat Sloughs, and has gas and restrooms available to its berths only; there are no public facilities. All three of these marinas are within the Primary Zone of the Delta. Solano County's "large" marina is Delta Marina Yacht Harbor located in Rio Vista on the Sacramento River just outside of the Legal Delta, but directly adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone. Delta Marina Yacht Harbor includes 275 berths, a launch ramp, 25 RV camping sites, fishing access, and a pump-out for its guests.

There are five launching facilities within Solano County. Three ramps are in the private marinas (see above). Solano County also has two public ramps: the Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock, located near City Hall in Rio Vista along the Sacramento River; and Sandy Beach Park, a Solano County Regional Parks facility located south of Rio Vista, also on the Sacramento River. These two public ramps are located just outside of the Legal Delta. Fees are charged at most of these public launch facilities, and range from \$5 to \$8, with private facilities charging up to \$10 to launch a boat.

Camping in Solano County is provided at four locations including: Delta Marina Yacht Harbor, with 25 RV camping sites; Arrowhead Harbor with eight RV sites; Snug Harbor

Resort, with 65 RV and nine tent camping sites and 17 "Snuggle Inn" rental cabins; and Sandy Beach Park, with 42 tent/RV camping sites. Fees for camping vary by facility, but generally range from \$15 to \$35, depending on whether it's on a weekend or whether an RV hookup is needed.

Picnic areas are located at several sites in Solano County including: Delta Marina Yacht Harbor, Arrowhead Harbor, Snug Harbor Resort, Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock, Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access, Sandy Beach Park, Jepson Prairie Preserve, and the Western Railway Museum. The picnic areas at the City of Rio Vista's two public sites are available for use free of charge. Reservations at private facilities are usually required for use of their picnic areas, Solano County charges a day use fee of \$5 at Sandy Beach Park, and the Western Railway Museum requires an admission fee (\$5-8) for use of its facilities.

Formal fishing access is provided at Snug Harbor Resort, which is privately owned; at a pier in Sandy Beach Park which is a Solano County Regional Parks facility with campsites, a trail, picnic sites, and a launch ramp; and at the two public access sites in Rio Vista – the Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock and the Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access. Fishing access is also available at the Department of Fish and Game's Miner Slough Wildlife Area and at the Department's Calhoun Cut Ecological Reserve. Both of these fishing access sites are accessible only by boat.

Trails are located at Sandy Beach Park, and the Solano Land Trust's Jepson Prairie Preserve, located on Calhoun Cut near Barker Slough. There are also small trails at the City of Rio Vista's public sites, usually from the waterway to a day use parking area or to the Rio Vista City Hall, as well as at the Western Railway Museum.

There is one private Yacht Club in the Solano County area of the Delta, which is located outside the boundaries of the Legal Delta in Rio Vista (Delta Marina Yacht Club).

The one public park in the Delta area of Solano County is Sandy Beach Park in Rio Vista on the Sacramento River. This park has 42 campsites, a fishing pier, a scenic trail, picnicking sites, and a launch ramp. The park is located outside of the Legal Delta, adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone. There is a \$5 fee for day use.

Three "other" facilities exist in Solano County. One is the Jepson Prairie Preserve, which is owned and managed by the Solano Land Trust (formerly Solano County Farmlands and Open Space Foundation). Designated a "National Natural Landmark" by the National Parks Service in 1987, the Preserve has a self-guided nature trail through its 1,566 acres of vernal pools and grasslands, as well as a shaded picnic area and a portable restroom facility. Another facility is the non-profit Western Railway Museum located at the Rio Vista Junction along Highway 12, between the Cities of Rio Vista and Suisun. This historic facility offers rail excursions through the Jepson Prairie Preserve during the in-wildflower season. The museum, which was recently enlarged, also has a visitor's center, gift shop, café, and picnicking facilities. Finally, the Dutra Museum of Dredging

in Rio Vista provides visitors with an opportunity to view photographs, logs, and other mementos associated with the early history of dredging in the Delta.

The Department of Fish and Game holds three properties in Solano County that are used as Wildlife Areas or Ecological Reserves. The Miner Slough Wildlife Area, located ten miles north of Rio Vista, allows hunting, fishing, and wildlife observation from boats. Decker Island Wildlife Area, located three miles south of Rio Vista at the north end of Decker Island, is accessible only by boat; fishing, hunting, and wildlife observation from boats is allowed. Finally, the Calhoun Cut Ecological Reserve, also accessible only by boat, allows fishing and hunting from boats.

The Hastings Island Hunting Preserve is a private upland game bird hunting facility occupying most of Hastings Tract, which is approximately 4,700 acres.

Dry boat storage for 40 boats is available at Snug Harbor Resort.

Bait and other fishing supplies are available at Snug Harbor Resort and Delta Marina Yacht Harbor. Hap's Bait, located within the City of Rio Vista, sells bait and equipment, and also serves as a popular information resource on fishing conditions in the Delta.



Solano County Facilities



Yolo County

Yolo County lies in the northernmost portion of the Delta and makes up about 15 percent of the Primary Zone, approximately 75,000 acres. The County lands are bisected by the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, which connects the Sacramento River near Rio Vista to the Port of Sacramento in West Sacramento. The lands west of the ship channel make up much of the Yolo Bypass, a federal floodway. The lands east of the ship channel include: Merritt Island, Little Holland Tract, and Liberty Island. The waterways in the County include Elk Slough, the Sacramento Deep Water Ship Channel, the Sacramento River, and Winchester Lake. The major city outside of the Primary Zone in Yolo County is West Sacramento. The only community in the Primary Zone is Clarksburg.

Since completion of the original inventory in 1997, there have been few changes to recreational facilities in Yolo County. A waterfront pedestrian promenade was constructed along the City of West Sacramento's waterfront, directly across the Sacramento River from the City of Sacramento's existing waterfront access. Also, Yolo County was able to upgrade its public boat launch ramp and fishing access south of Clarksburg utilizing funds from Proposition 12, which was approved by California voters in 2000; improvements at this site include parking and picnic areas. Yolo County is currently in the process of updating its Parks and Recreation Master Plan; included within this plan is reference to a Comprehensive Resource Management Plan for Lower Cache Creek, which addresses recreational uses of that area.

There are four marinas in Yolo County; two are "medium" marinas, containing 50 to 200 berths, and two are "small" marinas, with less than 50 berths. All of these marinas are privately owned. The two ~~three~~ "medium" marinas are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta and include: Sherwood Harbor Marina and the Sacramento Yacht Club, both in West Sacramento on the Sacramento River (note: the Four Seasons Marina in West Sacramento has closed down since the original inventory was conducted in 1997). The two small marinas are Clarksburg Marina and Stan's Yolo Marina; Clarksburg Marina is located in Clarksburg along the Sacramento River, in the Primary Zone, and Stan's Yolo Marina is in West Sacramento along the Sacramento River, in the Secondary Zone.

There are six launch facilities in Yolo County. Four of the six ramps are privately owned by marinas or clubs; of these four, one is for launching sailboats (Lake Washington Sailing Club) and another is for launching rowing boats (River City Rowing Club). There are also two launch ramps which are publicly owned and operated: Clarksburg Public Fishing Access/Boat Launch on Merritt Island on the Sacramento River, owned and managed by Yolo County, and Broderick Boat Ramp in West Sacramento, owned and managed by the City of West Sacramento, on the Sacramento River.

Only one facility in the Yolo County portion of the Delta provides camping sites: the Sherwood Harbor Marina in West Sacramento on the Sacramento River. This facility has 40 camping sites, 110 berths, and areas designated for picnicking.

Fishing access is provided at Clarksburg Public Fishing Access/Boat Launch on Merritt Island on the Sacramento River.

There are three private yacht or sailing clubs in the Yolo County portion of the Delta. At the Port of Sacramento there is a private sailing club (Lake Washington Sailing Club) and a private rowing club (River City Rowing Club) on the Deep Water Ship Channel; in addition, the Sacramento Yacht Club is located in the City of West Sacramento. All three of these sites are in the Secondary Zone.

The 15,830-acre Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area just south of I-80 is jointly managed by Department of Fish and Game and its nonprofit partner, the Yolo Basin Foundation. A driving tour and trails are open for wildlife viewing, and public fishing and hunting are allowed in some areas. The Department and the Foundation have initiated a planning process in 2004, through which some of the acreage added to the Wildlife Area in 2002 could be opened up to public access. Possible future recreational amenities at the Wildlife Area may include more hunting areas and trails, a visitor's center with interpretive displays, nature observation areas, and possibly fishing and small non-motorized boat access facilities.

There are seventeen private duck clubs (hunting clubs) in Yolo County, all located in the Yolo Bypass. The clubs vary greatly in size ranging from 30 acres to 3,244 acres. Hunting opportunities for the public exist at the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area, owned and operated by the CA Department of Fish and Game.

The Yolo Shortline Railroad, now known as the Sacramento River Train, provides excursion trips from Woodland to the City of West Sacramento, north of Clarksburg. The City of West Sacramento recently issued a Notice of Determination for acquisition of ten miles of the Clarksburg Line from the Sierra Northern Railway Company, as part of its Rails-to-Trails program. The acquisition includes proposed development of a multi-use recreational trail that utilizes a 3.25-mile segment of the corridor, and a one-mile trail easement to the south, on the remainder. This project would be located in both the Primary and Secondary Zones of the Delta (West Sacramento south to Clarksburg).

There are several wineries in Yolo County that open their doors to the public for wine tasting and wine sales, particularly in the Clarksburg area. One of the biggest and most well-known is Bogle Vineyards & Winery; others include Ehrhardt Estates Winery, River Grove Winery, Salman Farms, Clarksburg Wine Company LLC, and Wilson Vineyards.

Dry boat storage is available at the River City Rowing Club; these storage areas are used to store the club's canoeing and kayaking equipment.

Bait and fishing supplies are available at Sherwood Harbor Marina, as well as at the Penny Bait Shop located near the Sacramento River in West Sacramento.



Sacramento County

Sacramento County is located in the northeastern and western area of the Delta, from I-5 southwest to the confluence of the Sacramento and San Joaquin Rivers, covering about 95,000 acres, approximately 19 percent of the Primary Zone. Additional County lands are in the Secondary Zone and outside the Legal Delta and provide access to the Delta waters. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: Pierson District, Sutter Island, Grand Island, McCormack Williamson Tract, Dead Horse Island, Tyler Island, Brannan-Andrus Island, Twitchell Island, and Sherman Island. Much of Brannan-Andrus Island north of Highway 12 is in the Secondary Zone. The State of California owns much of the land in the southernmost part of the County, including large portions of Sherman and Twitchell Islands, and Brannan Island State Recreation Area. Delta water areas include Georgiana Slough, the North Fork of the Mokelumne River, the Sacramento Deep Water Channel, the Sacramento River, the San Joaquin River, and Sevenmile Slough. Cities and communities within the Primary Zone include: Courtland, Hood, Locke, Walnut Grove, and Ryde. The City of Isleton is located in the Secondary Zone.

Since the original Inventory was completed in November 1997, several recreational enhancements have been constructed in Sacramento County. The Delta community of Walnut Grove and the City of Isleton have both installed public guest docks along their respective waterfronts; Walnut Grove's public dock is handicap-accessible and allows fishing at some times, and Isleton's dock is a land- and water-based facility that includes a fishing pier, parking lot, and restrooms. In addition, the City of Sacramento expanded its waterfront promenade south of Capitol Bridge. Sacramento County has also enhanced its park at the tip of Sherman Island; the park, which is very popular with windsurfers, now allows self-contained RV camping, and includes trails, picnic tables, public restrooms, and more parking spaces, in addition to a boat launch ramp and fishing access. A new privately-owned facility, Rio Viento, was constructed on Sherman Island bordering the Sacramento River; Captain's Table, a hotel with guest dock, was approved for construction along the Sacramento River in the City of Sacramento in 2002; and Moore's Riverboat Marina on Andrus Island added a 51-space RV park to its existing facilities in 2000. The Department of Parks and Recreation expanded upon its holdings in the Delta Meadows River Park by acquiring an additional 300-acre area behind the town of Locke. The Department of Parks and Recreation is currently requesting funding to complete a General Plan for the Delta Meadows property; the property currently consists of a small launching area for canoes and kayaks, a portable restroom, and a gravel trail.

In addition to the aforementioned enhancements to existing recreational facilities and areas, it should also be noted that there have been a couple of new startup businesses in the Delta area that focus on eco-tourism. Dr. Jeff Hart, who operates Hartland Nursery on Grand Island along Steamboat Slough, also operates *Delta EcoTours*, specializing in boat tours and education on the Delta's history and resources, for groups of up to 25 people. Another new eco-tourism company is A & J Tours, based out of Walnut Grove, which specializes in custom-designed canoe, kayak, and flyfishing trips through the North Delta and on the American River.

Sacramento County is home to a variety of public and privately owned small, medium and large sized marinas. "Small" marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are thirteen small marinas; all are privately owned with a berth range of 12 to 40. Most are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta and grouped around Andrus Island, the City of Sacramento, and the Walnut Grove area. One is located outside the Legal Delta, in the City of Sacramento.

Sixteen "medium" marinas exist in the County; all are privately owned. Medium marinas have between 50 and 200 berths. Those within Sacramento County range from 60 to 200 berths. These medium sized marinas are primarily found in the areas surrounding the City of Sacramento, Andrus Island, Sherman Island, Brannan Island, and Walnut Grove; most of these are located within the Primary Zone of the Delta. Two are located outside the Legal Delta, in the City of Sacramento, with access to the waters of the Primary Zone.

Five "large" marinas are located in Sacramento County, each containing over 200 berths. All of these marinas are privately owned, except for the Sacramento Marina in the City of Sacramento, on the Sacramento River. The Sacramento Marina is one of the largest with 547 berths, a four-lane launch ramp, and a trail. Most of the "large" marinas are grouped on Andrus Island within the Primary Zone of the Delta.

There are a large number of launch ramps throughout Sacramento County, most of which are located in the Primary Zone, with a few in the Secondary Zone and outside of the Legal Delta. The ramps are clustered in the City of Sacramento and around Andrus, Brannan, and Sherman Islands. Many of the ramps are in privately owned marinas. Some of the ramps are located at public launch facilities, which also often include picnic sites, public trails, fishing access, and sometimes beach access and windsurfing sites. A very large facility is located at the Department of Parks and Recreation's Brannan Island State Recreation Area on Brannan Island on the Sacramento River. Brannan Island State Recreation Area also has 28 berths, 167 camping sites, a visitor's center, picnic facilities, fishing access, public trails, and beach access.

Tent and RV camping sites are located in Sacramento County. Most of the camping sites are located in privately owned marinas. These camping sites are primarily on Brannan Island, Andrus Island, and in the City of Sacramento. Brannan Island State Recreation Area has extensive camping facilities, as well as a six-lane launch ramp. Several private marinas and resorts provide campsites. Delta Isle, a private RV park on Andrus Island, has the largest number of camping sites with 220 RV and tent sites. This resort also includes 40 berths, picnic facilities, and a fishing pier.

There are a large number of picnic areas provided throughout Sacramento County in both public and private facilities. All of the publicly owned launch ramp and fishing access sites also provide picnicking sites; day use fees are usually around \$5.

Formal fishing access is located at a few private marinas, and is generally provided at the publicly owned launch ramps and parks. Sacramento County provides fishing access at

several sites along the Sacramento River including the Cliffhouse Fishing Access, Hogback Recreation Area, Sherman Island Launch Ramp, and Georgiana Slough Fishing Access. Again, a day use fee and/or launch fee of about \$5 to \$8 is charged at these facilities.

Trails in the Primary Zone are limited in number. Brannan Island State Recreation Area has numerous trails, and the Department of Parks and Recreation has converted the old railroad right-of-way, at its Delta Meadows property behind Locke, to a gravel trail. There are also trails at the Cosumnes River Preserve and Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge, which allow wildlife observation. Additional trails in the Secondary Zone are located in the City of Sacramento at Discovery Park, Garcia Bend Park, and Miller Park. The City recently adopted a master plan to expand levee-top trails along the Sacramento and American Rivers, including a proposed Sacramento River Parkway bike trail in Sacramento's Pocket Area south to Freeport.

Two private Yacht Clubs are located in the Sacramento County area of the Delta, both in the Delta Primary Zone. In addition, there are private yacht clubs in the Cities of Sacramento, Loomis, and Folsom that visit the Delta regularly.

The only State parks in the Delta are located in Sacramento County: Brannan Island State Recreation Area and Delta Meadows River Park, near Locke. There is also a private/public preserve, Cosumnes River Preserve, on the Cosumnes River and a federal wildlife refuge, Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge, at Stone Lakes, located just southwest of the City of Elk Grove. The Refuge includes lands owned by Sacramento County, the State of California, and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service initiated a public process for the development of a Comprehensive Conservation Plan (CCP) for the Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge in 2003; this plan will dictate how the Refuge will be opened up to regular public use. The CCP should be completed in 2005. Future uses that may be accommodated on the Refuge could include hunting and fishing, additional trails, wildlife observation areas, and small nonmotorized boat access.

All of these areas, except for parts of the Cosumnes River Preserve, are located within the Primary Zone of the Delta and have trails, although the Refuge trails are currently open on a limited basis. The Cosumnes Preserve has an on-site visitor facility, two launching areas for canoes and kayaks, picnic areas and restrooms, and some educational and interpretive signs along its nature trails. The Preserve does not charge any fees for day use, although small donations are requested for maps or other information about the trails. No fishing or hunting is allowed on the Preserve. The Preserve's visitor-serving amenities were augmented in 2002 with new restrooms, an expanded parking area, and trail improvements.

Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area at the southern end of Sherman Island is managed for public hunting and fishing from boats; there are no land facilities. This area is owned and managed by Department of Fish and Game, and is located in the Primary Zone. A master plan is under preparation and is to be completed in 2006. The

Department of Fish and Game also sponsors pheasant hunting on Sherman and Twitchell Islands on lands owned by the Department of Water Resources.

The Sacramento River, from Rio Vista to the tip of Sherman Island, provides unique opportunities for windsurfing. Formal and informal facilities support wind-surfing providing sales and rental of equipment, physical access to the water, and camping sites for windsurfers. The windsurfer support sites in Sacramento County are located on Brannan and Sherman Islands, bordering the Sacramento River, in the Primary Zone.

All but one of the registered historic sites in the Primary Zone are located within Sacramento County. Walnut Grove sites include Imperial Theater, Gauken Hall, the Walnut Grove Japanese-American Historic District, the Walnut Grove Chinese-American Historic District, the Walnut Grove Commercial/ Residential Historic District, and Jean Harvie School. Others historic sites in the County include: Rosebud Ranch near Hood, Chinese and Japanese Commercial Districts in Isleton, Delta Meadows (archeological site) near Locke, the Town of Locke, and the Grand Island Mansion (see map of Historic Sites).

Wineries in the Walnut Grove and Isleton areas include Six Hands and Gustafson Vineyards and Winery; there is also a winery in the Freeport area – Scribner Bend Vineyards.

There are over 1,000 dry boat storage spaces located at numerous recreational facilities throughout Sacramento County. The largest dry boat storage facilities are located at Happy Harbor and Delta Boat Storage, both on the Delta Loop. Dry boat storage is also available at Alamar Marina, B&W Resort, Boathouse Marina, Deckhands Marine Supply, Delta Bay Marina, Delta Isle, Eddo's Harbor, Ko-Ket Resort, Lighthouse Resort, Sherman Lake Resort, Metro Marina, Owl Harbor, Rancho Marina, Riverboat Marina, Walnut Grove Marina, Dagmar's Landing, and Isleton Boat Ramp & Storage.

Bait and fishing supplies are also available at many of the Sacramento County facilities, including B&W Resort, Boondox Liquors, Cliff's Marina, Delta Bay Marina, Duck Island RV Park, Eddo's Harbor, Ko-Ket Resort, Korth's Pirate's Lair Marina, Lighthouse Resort, Metro Marina, Outrigger Marina, Oxbow Marina, Perry's Boat Harbor, Rancho Marina, Riverboat Marina, Sacramento Marina, Vieira's Resort, and Walnut Grove Marina. In addition, there are several bait shops in the Sacramento County portion of the Delta, including: Romeo's Bait & Tackle, Delta Bait & Tackle, and Freeport Bait in Freeport; Bob's Bait Shop and Isleton Bait Shop in Isleton; and Bait, Boat & Tackle on the Delta Loop.







Contra Costa County

Contra Costa County is located in the southwestern portion of the Primary Zone and covers approximately 47,000 acres, about ten percent of the Primary Zone. Portions of the County are located within the Secondary Zone of the Delta and provide access to Primary Zone waters. Islands and tracts within the Primary Zone include: Browns Island (within the City of Pittsburg), Winter Island, Jersey Island, Bradford Island, Webb Tract, Holland Tract, Palm Tract, Orwood Tract, Knightsen area, and Coney Island. The areas in the Secondary Zone include: Bethel Island, Hotchkiss Tract, and Veale Tract. Water areas include: Big Break, partially owned by East Bay Regional Park District; Franks Tract (Department of Parks and Recreation), and Clifton Court Forebay (Department of Water Resources). Most of Jersey Island has been purchased by Ironhouse Sanitary District and is used for disposal of treated wastewater and biosolids. A recently approved and permitted pending private project proposes to use Webb Tract as a reservoir and much of Holland Tract as managed wetland and recreation areas (Delta Wetlands project). Major cities within the Secondary Zone include Antioch, Brentwood, Discovery Bay, Oakley, Bethel Island, and Pittsburg, and the community of Byron. The community of Knightsen is located within the Delta Primary Zone.

Since late 1997, when the original Inventory was published, there have been several projects that enhanced or modified recreational facilities in Contra Costa County, particularly on Bethel Island. One project of note is the Delta Coves project, a 310-acre residential project proposed on Bethel Island that would include breaching a levee, creating lagoons, and constructing a 150-berth marina, 495 boat docks, and about 560 residences. Delta Coves was approved in the 1970s, and was re-authorized after settlement of a lawsuit against the County. In addition, an 18-hole golf course, RV park, and campground on Bethel Island was approved in 2003. Marina modifications have included the purchase and incorporation of some smaller marinas on Bethel Island into larger ones (Sugar Barge and D'Anna's Bethel Island Resort), the addition of a 750' dock for houseboat rentals at Lindquist Landing, and the addition of dry boat storage units and parking spaces at two Bethel Island marinas. Dry boat storage was also increased at facilities on Hotchkiss and Orwood Tracts. Finally, East Bay Regional Parks District has increased its presence in the Delta, with its Big Break Regional Shoreline Park and proposed Delta Science Center at Big Break, and the acquisition of a 275-acre parcel on Orwood Tract which could become another park in the future. The Big Break Regional Shoreline Park received its approval in 2001, utilizing funds authorized under Proposition 12 in 2000, and currently provides boat access, a fishing pier, trails, a small boat launch, and wildlife observation and picnic areas. Another project of note is the Dutch Slough Project, a habitat restoration project funded by California Bay-Delta Program and California Coastal Conservancy grants, which will include development of trails and interpretive displays; the project is currently being designed. Finally, the Boating and Waterways Commission just recently approved \$280,000 for the first phase of improvements at the Antioch Marina; amenities to be added to the marina include a four-lane launch ramp, three boarding floats, a parking area, and restrooms.

Contra Costa County has a large number of marinas, both public and private. Many marinas provide for other recreational activities such as camping, fishing, houseboat rentals, and picnic sites. Small marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are fourteen small marinas within the Delta in Contra Costa County. They are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta in the Bethel Island and Hotchkiss Tract areas, and range in size from 8 berths to 46 berths (another facility, Rivers End Marina in Byron, consists of a private launch ramp and dry storage only with no berths, although a convenience store and fishing supplies are available, and RV camping is allowed). All of these small marinas are privately owned and operated.

Medium marinas are those which have between 50 to 200 berths. Fourteen medium sized marinas are located in the Secondary Zone of the Delta, again primarily in the Bethel Island area. The number of berths ranges from 50 to 160. All of these marinas are privately owned and operated.

Large marinas contain more than 200 berths. There are six large marinas within the County, located in Pittsburg and Antioch in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. The large marinas range from 203 to 650 berths. Most of these marinas are privately owned. There are two large public marinas: the Antioch Marina with 310 berths and a public trail, fishing pier, and other public amenities; and the Pittsburg Marina with 650 berths and a boat launch ramp.

There are many launch facilities within Contra Costa County. Most of the ramps are located within the private marinas in the Secondary Zone of the Delta, in the areas around Bethel Island and Hotchkiss Tract.

Camping sites are also found within the Contra Costa County portion of the Delta. Camping includes tent and RV campsites. All of the identified camping sites are privately owned, and located within marinas. The number of camping sites range from about 2 to 114 sites. Sugar Barge Marina, on Bethel Island, has the largest number of camping sites with 114 RV spaces. Sugar Barge also provides a two-lane launch ramp, picnic area, and park with playground.

A limited number of picnic areas are provided at private marinas: there are several private facilities on Bethel Island that include picnic areas, a couple of facilities on Orwood Tract, and a few in Antioch, Pittsburg, and Oakley. Publicly owned picnic areas are provided at: Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp in Antioch on the San Joaquin River; Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River; Riverview Park in Pittsburg on the Sacramento River; and Barbara Price Marina Park in Antioch on the Sacramento River. These public parks do not charge a fee for day use.

Formal fishing access is provided at only a few marinas and at several sites created specifically for fishing. The marinas that provide fishing access are privately owned. Public fishing sites include: Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River; Clifton Court Forebay near Italian Slough; Franks Tract State Recreation Area (boat access only); Riverview Park in Pittsburg on the Sacramento

River; and Riverview Lodge Pier in Pittsburg on the Sacramento River. Most of these fishing access sites are located in the Antioch and Pittsburg areas, although a couple of private marinas on Bethel Island also provide fishing access.

Trail sites in Contra Costa County include the Antioch Riverfront Promenade, Antioch Marina in Antioch along the San Joaquin River, and the 5.5-mile-long Marsh Creek Trail between Oakley and Brentwood along Marsh Creek, and the Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline.

Six private Yacht Clubs are located within the Delta area of Contra Costa County. They are located within the Secondary Zone of the Delta, primarily in Antioch and around Bethel Island, as well as in Oakley and Discovery Bay. In addition, there are several other yacht clubs in Contra Costa County located outside of the Legal Delta – in cities such as Concord, San Ramon, Walnut Creek, Pleasant Hill, Martinez, Dublin, Richmond, and Bay Point – which visit the Delta regularly.

Three public parks are located on the Delta waterfront. One is East Bay Regional Park District's Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline in Antioch on the Sacramento River in the Secondary Zone, which includes facilities for picnicking and fishing. Another is the Barbara Price Marina Park in Antioch on the Sacramento River, also in the Secondary Zone, which contains picnic facilities and a public walkway. Finally, the City of Pittsburg's Riverview Park, located near the Pittsburg Marina, has trails, picnic areas, and fishing access. East Bay Regional Park District owns Browns Island and the western half of Big Break; neither site has any improved recreational facilities. The District has plans for recreational improvements to occur at Big Break: a fishing pier is currently under construction, and parking areas, restrooms, and trails are slated for construction in fall of 2005. East Bay Regional Park District also acquired some property near the Orwood Resort on Orwood Tract in 2002, utilizing bond funds from Proposition 12, which was approved by voters in 2000 and grant funds. This property may be developed into a public park in the future.

The Antioch Dunes National Wildlife Refuge, owned and operated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, is dedicated to the preservation and enhancement of three endangered species; public access to the property is limited, although educational tours of the area are held periodically.

Franks Tract State Recreation Area and Big Break allow public hunting access during waterfowl hunting season. Franks Tract is located in the Primary Zone of the Delta and allows fishing from boats as well; hunting is allowed from permitted floating blinds and from boats. Big Break, near Oakley, has been used for waterfowl hunting for many years; EBRPD will allow hunting to continue from floating blinds or boats on the water-covered areas. The Department of Fish and Game's Rhode Island Wildlife Area also allows fishing and hunting from boats only. In addition to these public opportunities, there are private hunting clubs operating on Winter Island and Veale Tract.

There are over 2,500 dry boat storage spaces located at numerous recreation facilities throughout Contra Costa County. The largest, with over 600 berths, is located at the Discovery Bay Yacht Harbor in Discovery Bay. Dry boat storage is also offered at New Anchor Marina, Emerald Point Marina, Beacon Harbor, Bethel Harbor, Big Break Marina, Carol's Harbor, Lundborgh Landing, Driftwood Marina, Franks Marina, Hennis Marina, Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, Lloyd's Holiday Harbor, Pittsburg Marina, Russo's Harbor, Sea Horse Marina, Rock Slough Marina (formerly Lindquist Landing), Orwood Resort, Lazy M Marina, Sugar Barge Marina, and Rivers End Marina (formerly Del's Boat Harbor).

Bait is also available at many of the Contra Costa County marina facilities, including New Anchor Marina, Emerald Point Marina, Bentley's, Big Break Marina, Carol's Harbor, Lundborgh Landing, Harris Marina, Pittsburg Marina, Russo's Harbor, Orwood Resort, Discovery Bay Yacht Harbor, Lazy M Marina, Sugar Barge Marina, and Rivers End Marina. There are also several bait shops located throughout the Contra Costa County portion of the Delta, including: McAvoy's, J&B Bait, and the Bait Shop in Pittsburg; Bales Bait & Tackle and Tommy's Bait & Tackle in Antioch; Hook Line & Sinker and Mission Bait & Mart in Oakley; and Chuck's Bait & Tackle on Bethel Island.







San Joaquin County

San Joaquin County's Primary Zone lands are located in the southern and western sections of the Legal Delta covering about 190,000 acres, approximately 39 percent of the Primary Zone. The lands include the areas generally bound by I-5 to the east, Old River to the south, Old River and the Mokelumne River to the west and the Mokelumne River to the north. Waterways in the Primary Zone include: Bear Creek, the Calaveras River, the Stockton Deep Water Channel, the Middle River, the North and South Forks of the Mokelumne River, Old River, and the San Joaquin River. Islands and tracts in the Primary Zone include: New Hope Tract, Canal Ranch, Brack Tract, Terminous Tract, Staten Island, Bouldin Island, Venice Island, Empire Tract, King Island, Mandeville Island, Medford Island, Rindge Tract, McDonald, Bacon Island, Lower and Upper Jones Tract, Lower, Middle, and Upper Roberts Islands, Union Island, Fabian Tract, Woodward Tract, and Victoria Island. Much of the City of Stockton is located in the Secondary Zone, with some City lands on Roberts Island in the Primary Zone.

Since the original Inventory was completed in 1997, several public and private facilities in San Joaquin County have been enhanced or modified. The City of Stockton has constructed a pedestrian promenade along the City's waterfront at the Weber Point Events Center; it also expanded its public marina at Morelli Park from about 100 berths to nearly 300, and it expanded its public launch ramp at Buckley Cove from four to six lanes. A new dock and private marina was constructed for the San Joaquin Delta Power Squadron, a non-profit organization dedicated to boater education, on the San Joaquin River across from Delta Yacht Club, and the New Hope Marina, which was destroyed by floodwaters in 1997, was reconstructed. Two new dry boat/RV storage facilities were approved; one near Stockton and one near Highway 12. Other changes include moorage of the Port Stockton Yacht Club at an existing marina, and inclusion of a swimming area adjacent to Lost Isle.

Numerous marinas are located within the County boundaries; all of these marinas are privately owned and operated. Small marinas contain 50 or fewer berths. There are six small marinas which range from 17 to 43 berths. Two additional facilities, the Union Point Resort and 5-Star Marina, consist of a private launch ramp, a guest dock, and dry storage only with no berths. Four of these marinas are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta; two are located within the Secondary Zone. These six small marinas are scattered throughout the Delta: one on the Middle River, two on the San Joaquin River, two on the South Fork of the Mokelumne River, and one on the Port of Stockton Deep Water Ship Channel.

Medium marinas contain between 50 to 200 berths. Eight medium marinas are located in the Primary and Secondary Zones of the Delta. Some are on the banks of the San Joaquin River and the Port of Stockton Deep Water Ship Channel; others are located along Disappointment Slough, Fabian and Bell Canals, Turner Cut, and Whiskey Slough. An additional facility, Lost Isle, serves as a destination consisting of a 200 slips, a guest dock, a restaurant, and beach area; it is a day-use, commercial facility accessible only by

boat. Houseboat rentals are available at several medium marinas: Herman and Helen's; Tracy Oasis; and Turner Cut Resort.

Large marinas contain more than 200 berths. Six large marinas are located in the Primary and -Secondary Zones. These large marinas range from 201 to 700 berths. Three of the six large marinas in San Joaquin County are located in the City of Stockton, and the other three are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta bordering Honker Cut and Disappointment Slough, Potato Slough, and Turner Cut. The largest marina in the Delta, Village West Marina with 700 berths, is located on Fourteen Mile Slough in the City of Stockton. A few large marinas provide houseboat rentals: King Island Resort; Paradise Point Marina; and Tower Park Marina. All of the large marinas include picnic facilities and a boat launch ramp.

There are numerous launching facilities within San Joaquin County. Most of the private marinas have launch ramps available for public use for a fee. Public boat launch facilities include: Morelli Park and Buckley Cove Park in Stockton on the Port of Stockton Deep Water Ship Channel; Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River; Louis Park in Stockton on the Smith Canal; and Mossdale Crossing in Lathrop on the San Joaquin River. Many of these publicly owned sites include other recreational facilities for picnicking, fishing, camping, and hiking.

Tent and RV camping sites are located throughout the Delta area of San Joaquin County. Most of the camping areas are privately owned and located in marinas; however, there are several publicly owned sites, including Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River with 24 camping sites, a launch ramp, picnicking sites and fishing access; and Westgate Landing on Terminous Tract by the Mokelumne River which has 14 camping sites, 24 berths, picnicking areas, and a fishing pier. The largest camping area is at Tower Park Marina, on Terminous Tract on Little Potato Slough, with 400 camping sites, 390 berths, a launch ramp, and picnicking sites.

There are a large number of picnic areas located within the San Joaquin County portion of the Delta in privately owned marinas and in publicly owned parks. Public picnicking areas are located at American Legion Park in Stockton, Buckley Cove Park in Stockton on the Deep Water Channel, Dos Reis Park in the Lathrop Area on the San Joaquin River, Louis Park in Stockton, Morelli Park in Stockton, Mossdale Crossing in Lathrop on the San Joaquin River, and Westgate Landing on Terminous Island on the Mokelumne River. Marinas which offer picnic facilities to berthers include: King Island Resort, Paradise Point Marina, Tiki Lagoon, Tower Park, and Windmill Cove.

Formal fishing access is located at seven locations in San Joaquin County. Most formal fishing access is located in publicly owned parks or wildlife areas in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts is a 272-acre wildlife area managed by the Department of Fish and Game which allows fishing access, hunting, and hiking. Other formal fishing access areas are located in the Stockton, Lathrop, and Lodi areas at American Legion Park, Buckley Cove Park, Dos Reis Park, Fritz Grupe Park, Louis Park, and Westgate Landing. In addition, one privately owned

marina – Ladd’s Stockton Marina – provides fishing access to its guests, and is also a very popular facility for local fishing tournaments.

There are eight public trails in San Joaquin County near the Delta waterways. These include: the Bike and Jogging Path in Stockton along on the Calaveras River; Louis Park in Stockton on the Smith Canal; Fritz Grupe Park in Stockton; McLeod Park near Stockton’s City Hall; Van Buskirk Park in Stockton on Walker Slough; Waterfront Yacht Harbor in downtown Stockton (pedestrian promenade); White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts; and the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve near Lodi. Many new developments in the Secondary Zone in the City of Lathrop and the community of Mountain House will include pedestrian paths on or along the levees along Delta waterways.

Twelve private Yacht Clubs were inventoried in San Joaquin County; many are located on the banks of the Stockton Deep Water Channel. Several different boating clubs out of Stockton and Lodi frequently visit the Delta waterways.

Nine public parks are located on the waterfront of San Joaquin County. The City of Stockton sites include American Legion Park, Buckley Cove Park, Fritz Grupe Park, Louis Park, McLeod Park, and Van Buskirk Park. County-owned public parks include Dos Reis Park, Mossdale Crossing Park, and Westgate Landing; Westgate Landing is located in the Primary Zone. These parks provide a variety of recreational amenities including fishing access, camping and picnicking facilities, trails, and launch ramps.

Two special wildlife facilities are found in San Joaquin County. One of these facilities is White Slough Wildlife Area on Terminous and Shin Kee Tracts. This area, owned by the State Department of Fish and Game, allows fishing and hunting. The other facility is the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve on Brack Tract by Hog Slough, owned and managed by the Department of Fish and Game as seasonal Sandhill Crane habitat. The Department allows wildlife viewing with docent supervision at this facility. In addition to these public sites, there are several private hunting and duck clubs operating in the San Joaquin County area of the Delta.

Finally, areas just outside of the Delta in San Joaquin County have been experiencing tremendous growth in the cultivation of wine grapes for other California wineries, as well as in the production of wines within the County, but there are no wineries located in the San Joaquin County portion of the Delta.

There are nearly 1,000 dry boat storage spaces available at San Joaquin County’s recreational facilities, including King Island Resort, Paradise Point Marina, 5-Star Marina, Riverpoint Landing, Tiki Lagun, Tower Park Marina, Tracy Oasis Marina, Turner Cut Resort, Village West Marina, Whiskey Slough Harbor, and Windmill Cove Marina.

Bait and other fishing supplies are also available at many marina facilities in the San Joaquin County portion of the Delta, including Bullfrog Landing, Haven Acres Marina,

Herman & Helen's Marina, King Island Resort, Ladd's Stockton Marina, Paradise Point Marina, Tiki Lagoon, Tower Park Marina, Tracy Oasis Marina, Turner Cut Resort, Whiskey Slough Harbor, and Wimpy's Marina.

San Joaquin County has only one winery in the Delta area: Benson Ferry Vineyards, located near the confluence of the Cosumnes and Mokelumne Rivers, in the Secondary Zone of the Delta.



DESCRIPTION OF RECREATIONAL FACILITIES BY TYPE

This section of the inventory describes the recreational facilities in the Primary Zone, in the Secondary Zone, and directly adjacent to the Legal Delta by type. The same data collection methodology used to prepare the geographic description of recreation facilities (county by county) was used for this section (see attached list of sources). The written descriptions are followed by charts and by maps that illustrate the location of the recreation facilities deltawide. In the charts, the facilities are grouped by County. The types of facilities are listed in alphabetical order.

Bait/Fishing Supplies

Bait and other fishing supplies can be found at over forty recreational facilities and resorts in the Delta, as well as at grocery and convenience stores in and around the Delta. In many cases, bait is available at small grocery or convenience stores located in the cities surrounding the Delta or in Delta communities. There are also several bait shops located in Pittsburg, Antioch, Isleton, Freeport, Rio Vista and other communities located along Delta waterways. One bait shop of note is Hap's Bait in Rio Vista; Hap's Bait sells fishing equipment and convenience items as well as bait, and is considered to be the place where anglers can get the most comprehensive information about fishing in Delta waterways.

Boat Launch Facilities

Boat launch facilities are an amenity found in almost every public and private marina in the Delta area. Most marinas provide at least one launch ramp (a concrete "driveway" into the water where a boat on a trailer is backed into the water, then allowed to float off). Most launch ramps also provide a dock to secure boats after they are launched. Some other marinas provide a launch sling from a crane-type structure, or a hoist on a truck. These facilities are sometimes provided if there is inadequate space for a launch ramp, or if there is a large storage facility on site and using a truck eases launching of boats stored on site.

In addition to boat launch facilities in public and private marinas, there is a number of publicly owned boat launching facilities. These launch facilities are often used by day users, such as water-skiers, to launch personal watercraft, or by fishermen. Fishermen particularly like to have access to launch facilities early in the morning.

There have been very few changes in the number of launch facilities in the Delta since 1997. Launch lanes have been added at Buckley Cove, Morelli Park, Discovery Park, and Brannan Island State Park, but the closing down of other private facilities since 1997 has generally offset any increase in the number of launch lanes.

Public boat launch facilities include: Sandy Beach Regional Park, Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock, Broderick Boat Ramp, Clarksburg Public Fishing Access/Boat Launch, Brannan Island State Recreation Area, Discovery Park, Hogback Island Recreation Area, Miller Park, Sacramento Marina, Sherman Island Launch Ramp, Tiscornia Park, Antioch Marina, Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp, Pittsburg Marina, Riverview Park, Clifton

County Forebay (during hunting season only), Buckley Cove Park, Dos Reis Park, Louis Park, Morelli Boat Ramp Park, and Mossdale Crossing Park. There is often a fee charged for use of these public launch ramps.

Of these public boat launch facilities, five are in the Primary Zone, nine are in the Secondary Zone, and seven are out of the Legal Delta.

The Delta Boating Needs Assessment completed in 2002 noted that several recreational groups, including anglers, water skiers and wakeboarders, and the general public, cited a lack of launch ramps in the Delta, particularly in the Central Delta and West Delta. According to the report, this is largely because many private marinas offer launch ramps as a courtesy to tenants, but they are not always available for use to the public.

Camping and Picnic Sites

There have been a few changes in the availability of camping and picnic areas since 1997. Most of the changes have been through the expansion of picnic areas at public parks. In addition, Sacramento County's public park at the tip of Sherman Island added a large RV camping area, Moore's Riverboat Marina added a RV camping area to its facility, and another private facility, Rio Viento, was constructed near the windsurfing access areas on Sherman Island.

Camping sites are located throughout the Delta, often in association with larger park or resort facilities. Some smaller facilities offer a limited number of camping sites. Forty-eight facilities offer camping. Many of the larger marinas in the Delta area provide a suite of recreational facilities to provide for a variety of recreational activities during a vacation or visit. For example, a marina will often provide berths, a launch facility, camping sites, picnic and barbecue facilities, fishing access and water access.

Examples of this type of multi-use facility featuring RV and/or tent camping include Delta Marina Yacht Harbor, Sandy Beach Regional Park, Arrowhead Harbor, Snug Harbor, Sherwood Harbor Marina, B & W Resort, Brannan Island State Park, Bruno's Island Yacht Harbor, Delta Bay Marina & RV Park Resort, Delta Isle, Duck Island RV Park, Eddo's Harbor and RV Park, Freeport Marina, Happy Harbor, Ko-Ket Resort, Korth's Pirates Lair Marina, Lighthouse Resort, -Sherman Lake Resort, Outrigger Marina, Owl Harbor, Oxbow Marina, Martin's Rainbow Resort, Rancho Marina Resort, Vieira's Resort, Walnut Grove Marina, The River (formerly Meaders Resort), New Anchor Marina, Beacon Harbor, Bentley's Marina & RV Park, Bethel Harbor, Boyd's Harbor, Lundborg Landing (formerly Delta Resort), Frank's Marina, Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, Russo's Marina, Orwood Resort, Dos Reis Park, King Island Resort, Riverpoint Landing, Tiki Lagoon, Tower Park Marina, Tracy Oasis Marina, Turner Cut Resort, Westgate Landing Park, Whiskey Slough Harbor, and Windmill Cove Marina. Most of the larger marinas and resorts that provide camping are located in the Primary Zone of the Delta. Facilities at private marinas are available to tenants and their guests, not the general public. In addition, some of the resorts are managed as private clubs, with use by members only. It should be noted there are very few other options for overnight lodging

in the Primary Zone. Some of the larger public marinas have facilities available to the general public, such as trails and picnic areas.

As noted above, picnic facilities are often provided as part of a suite of improvements at larger facilities inviting several days' stay. Private marinas that include picnic areas are: Delta Marina Yacht Harbor, Arrowhead Harbor, Snug Harbor, Sherwood Harbor Marina, B&W Resort, Bruno's Island Yacht Harbor, Delta Bay Marina & RV Park Resort, Delta Isle, Duck Island RV Park, Eddo's Harbor & RV Park, Freeport Marina, Happy Harbor, Ko-Ket Resort, Korth's Pirates Lair Marina, Lighthouse Resort, Sherman Lake Resort, Metro Marina, Outrigger Marina, Owl Harbor, Oxbow Marina, Perry's Boat Harbor, Martin's Rainbow Resort, Rancho Marina Resort, Vieira's Resort, Walnut Grove Marina, Windcraft Sailboard Center, Rio Viento RV Park, New Anchor Marina, Beacon Harbor, Bethel Harbor, Big Break Marina, Boyd's Harbor, Lundborg Landing (formerly Delta Resort), Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, Russo's Marina, Orwood Resort, Lazy M Marina, Sugar Barge Marina, King Island Resort, New Hope Landing, Paradise Point Marina, Riverpoint Landing (formerly Stephens Anchorage), Tiki Lagoon, Tower Park Marina, Tracy Oasis Marina, Turner Cut Resort, and Windmill Cove Marina & RV Park. Of these sites, 35 are located in the Primary Zone, ten are in the Secondary Zone, and two are outside of the Legal Delta.

In addition, 27 public day use facilities provide picnic areas as part of a suite of improvements aimed at boaters and fishermen. Public parks and facilities with picnicking areas include: Sandy Beach Park; the Western Railway Museum; Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock; Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access; Jepson Prairie Preserve; Clarksburg Public Fishing Access/Boat Launch; Brannan Island State Park; Cliffhouse Fishing Access; Cosumnes River Preserve; Discovery Park; Garcia Bend Park; Hogback Island Recreation Area; Miller Park; Sacramento Marina; Sherman Island Launch Ramp; Windy Cove Park; B. Price Marina Park; Antioch Marina; Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp; Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline; Riverview Park; American Legion Park; Buckley Cove Park; Louis Park; Morelli Park Boat Ramp; Mossdale Crossing Park; and Westgate Landing Park. Most of these sites are public, or managed by a non-profit group, and are available free or with a modest day use fee. Seven of these day use sites with picnic facilities are located in the Primary Zone, twelve in the Secondary Zone, and eight outside the Legal Delta. Many of the facilities are in Sacramento and Stockton, areas with large populations that seek access to the waters of the Delta.

The Delta Boating Needs Assessment completed in 2002 noted that anglers and windsurfers cited a lack of campgrounds throughout the Delta for these user groups. While the Assessment identified a surplus of campsites at boating-based Delta marinas and resorts, anglers and windsurfers felt that campgrounds should also be developed to serve recreational groups other than just boaters.

Dry Boat Storage

Over the last several years, there has been a concerted effort at many marinas and other facilities to provide more dry boat storage areas for boaters. Dry boat storage is used primarily by people who occasionally take their small boats (defined as trailerable boats

that are less than 26' in length) out in the Delta for day use on weekends during the summer boating season. In many cases, these people find that renting a dry boat storage unit is cheaper and less damaging to their boats than berthing their boats in water at a marina year-round.

Dry boat storage exists at over fifty recreational facilities and resorts in the Delta. One trend that has been noticed during the completion of this inventory update is the increase in the sizes of the boats that are recreating in the Delta – particularly with respect to sailboats and yachts. This has implications for guest dock and berthing availability, as space at all of the facilities is limited, but also for dry boat storage facilities, which must be able to accommodate the larger boats as well as the smaller boats.

Since 1997, several dry boat storage projects have been approved in Contra Costa and San Joaquin Counties. Over 500 boat storage spaces have been constructed under five different projects within the two counties – three in Contra Costa (two located on Bethel Island and one on Orwood Tract), and two in San Joaquin (one along Highway 12 near the Delta Loop and one just west of Stockton at Highway 4).

Fishing Access

Formal fishing access on the shoreline is provided at a number of locations in the Primary Zone, the Secondary Zone and adjacent to the Legal Delta. In addition, many fishermen fish from their boats and many people have historically fished from the banks of the levees, adjacent to public roadways. Recently some Reclamation Districts have been posting “No Trespassing” signs on levees due to growing concerns over trash and vandalism. The informal parking sites along the roadways and waterways are not included in this inventory.

Fishing is provided in a number of the larger marinas, again as part of a suite of amenities for recreational users. In addition, many public day use facilities emphasize fishing access and facilities. The public day use facilities with fishing access include: Sandy Beach Regional Park; Rio Vista Public Courtesy Dock; Rio Vista Riverbank Fishing Access; Clarksburg Public Boat Launch Ramp; Brannan Island State Recreation Area; Cliffhouse Fishing Access; Delta Meadows River Park; Discovery Park; Garcia Bend Park; Georgiana Slough Fishing Access; Hogback Island Recreation Area; Miller Park; Sherman Island Launch Ramp; Tiscornia Park; Antioch Marina; Antioch Municipal Boat Ramp; Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline; Riverview Lodge Pier; Riverview Park; Clifton Court Forebay; Buckley Cove Park; Dos Reis Park; Fritz Grupe Park; Louis Park; Westgate Landing Park; and White Slough State Wildlife Area.

There are also several water-covered areas owned and managed by public agencies which are available for fishing from boats only. These include Big Break and Browns Island, Franks Tract, and Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area.

The distribution of fishing access sites includes 22 sites in the Primary Zone, 12 in the Secondary Zone, and six outside the Legal Delta.

In the Delta Boating Needs Assessment completed in 2002, anglers cited several requirements they felt were lacking in the Delta, including launch ramps, campgrounds, restrooms, and minimal day-use facilities with shore or pier fishing access and amenities.

Historic Sites in the Primary Zone of the Delta

A number of sites in the Primary Zone on the National Federal Register or listed as a California Registered Historical Landmark are described; sites in the Secondary Zone are not included in the inventory.

Most of the Historic Sites are located in Sacramento County. Near Hood is the Rosebud Ranch, a privately owned historic home. The entire Town of Locke is designated; Locke is the only rural Chinese community in the United States. The land under the community was recently purchased by Sacramento County to facilitate the creation and sale of lots to owners of the existing buildings. A community group will help guide future development. Locke is a well-known visitor destination and includes an old schoolhouse, a small private museum, restaurants, art galleries, and shops. Near Locke, Delta Meadows, has been listed recognizing the remnants of a Miwok village on one of the offshore islands. Within Walnut Grove, three neighborhoods on the east side of the River are designated: Japanese-American Historic District, the Chinese American Historic District, and the Commercial/Residential Historic District. In addition, the Gauken Hall and the Imperial Theater have been listed individually. These areas are in private ownership. In Isleton, the Chinese and Japanese Commercial Districts are designated; these areas are also privately owned.

Two sites in the Primary Zone are listed as California Points of Historical Interest. On Grand Island, the River Mansion is privately-owned but is available for rental for special events, serves Sunday brunch, and now has a limited number of rooms available for overnight stays. In Walnut Grove the Jean Harvie School is now a community center, owned and operated by Sacramento County.

The Western Railway Museum is outside the Legal Delta in Solano County but provides a starting point for excursion rail trips that travel into the Primary Zone. The Museum is a designated historic site.

Hunting Areas

Hunting is an activity that has long been associated with agricultural lands in the Primary Zone. Seasonal hunting on privately owned agricultural lands continues without any formal improvements or approvals. Hunting on private lands is allowed only with the permission of the landowner. The Department of Fish and Game sponsors hunts on lands owned by the Department of Water Resources on Sherman and Twitchell Islands, and also allows hunting at its Wildlife Areas and Ecological Reserves. Many of these areas are water-covered, limiting access to those with boats.

In addition to informal hunting, there are many hunting clubs in the Primary Zone. Most of the clubs are duck clubs, although there are some clubs which specialize in upland game bird hunting. The listing of duck clubs and hunting clubs is incomplete; records are

limited. Hunting and duck clubs are open to members and their guests only. There are 17 duck clubs in the Yolo Bypass area of Yolo County in the Primary Zone. The inventory lists a few additional duck clubs in other areas of the Primary Zone.

The only land areas in the Primary Zone available for public hunting are those owned by the Department of Fish and Game, including the White Slough State Wildlife Area and portions of the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area, as well as from boats at Rhode Island, Miner Slough, Calhoun Cut, and Decker Island Wildlife Areas. Publicly-owned water-covered areas available for public hunting include Sherman Island Waterfowl Management Area, Franks Tract, and parts of Big Break. Hunting will likely also be allowed on the Stone Lakes National Wildlife Refuge in Sacramento County once U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has completed its Comprehensive Conservation Plan, slated for 2005.

As part of the Delta Boating Needs Assessment completed in 2002, hunters were asked what, if anything, they felt was lacking at existing Delta facilities; they responded that they feel more car-top launch sites, parking areas, and both shore and floating restrooms were needed in the Delta to serve hunters.

Marinas

Marinas are found throughout the Delta, in the Primary Zone, the Secondary Zone, and outside the Legal Delta adjacent to the waters of the Primary Zone. Marinas in the Delta area range in size from six berths to 700 berths. They vary widely in age, in level of maintenance, and in type and number of amenities and improvements. For discussion purposes, in this inventory the marinas are grouped by size: Small Marinas are less than 50 berths, Medium Marinas with between 50 and 200 berths, and Large Marinas, with over 200 berths. Note there are a lot of inconsistencies in various sources regarding the number of berths in Delta marinas. Every attempt has been made to use the most recently available information regarding the number of berths. Any changes from the figures contained within the original 1997 Inventory can be explained by any or all of the following: the number of berths given for facilities in the original inventory may have been erroneous; small marinas may have increased the number of berths, causing the facilities to be categorized as medium or large marinas; and previously small or medium-sized marinas may have acquired other nearby marinas, and merged them into a larger facility.

The total number of marinas in the inventory is 96 – 51 in the Primary Zone, 41 in the Secondary Zone, and four outside the Legal Delta. The marinas have a total of 11,729 berths – 5,573 in the Primary Zone, 5,725 in the Secondary Zone, and 431 outside the Legal Delta.

Small Marinas: Under 50 Berths

The inventory includes 35 small marinas; 19 in the Primary Zone, 13 in the Secondary Zone, and two outside the Legal Delta. Other facilities that might have been included in the small marina category include Brannan Island State Recreation Area in Sacramento County and San Joaquin County's Westgate Landing Park. These two facilities do not conform to the usual description of marinas because the berths are not rented long term,

however, the slips are available for short-term rental to park visitors. In addition, Driftwood, Pittsburg, and Delta Yacht Clubs are not included because they are considered to be clubs rather than marinas. Finally, River's End Marina in Byron, and Union Point Resort and 5-Star Marina in Stockton, were excluded from this category because they are primarily storage facilities, not marinas.

Fourteen small marinas are located in Contra Costa County, in the Bethel Island/Hotchkiss Tract area in the Secondary Zone of the Delta. Many of these very small marinas are old and have limited access, parking, and amenities, although some have been upgraded and modernized. The small marinas in this area range in size from eight berths to 46 berths.

There are 13 small marinas in or adjacent to the Primary Zone of the Delta in Sacramento County. Eleven are located in the Primary Zone; two are outside the Legal Delta and provide access to the Delta waterways. Half of the small marinas in Sacramento County are located on Andrus Island and range in size from 12 to 42 berths. Two small marinas are located on Brannan Island and three are in Walnut Grove.

Six small marinas are located in San Joaquin County; all but one of these are in the Primary Zone. The small marinas range in size from seventeen to 43 berths.

Two small marinas are located in Yolo County. The Clarksburg Marina with six berths is in the Primary Zone, and Stan's Yolo Marina, with 20 berths, is located in West Sacramento in the Secondary Zone.

There are a total of 792 berths in the 35 small marinas in the inventory: 472 in the Primary Zone; 279 in the Secondary Zone; and 41 outside the Legal Delta.

Medium Marinas: Between 50 and 200 Berths

The inventory includes 44 medium sized marinas; 22 in the Primary Zone and 22 in the Secondary Zone. Of the medium sized marinas, all are privately owned. The largest number of medium sized marinas, sixteen, are located in Sacramento County. Of these sixteen facilities, two are in the Secondary Zone, one is outside of the Legal Delta, and the other thirteen are all in the Primary Zone. Of the thirteen marinas in the Primary Zone, one of the marinas is located in Locke, one in Walnut Grove, and the remaining are on Sherman, Brannan, and Andrus Islands. The medium marinas in Sacramento County range from 51 to 200 berths.

There are fourteen medium marinas in Contra Costa County. Only one of these fourteen facilities – Cruiser Haven on Veale Tract – is located in the Primary Zone; the other thirteen facilities are found on Bethel Island and in Oakley and Antioch. The medium marinas in Contra Costa County range from 50 to 160 berths.

There are eight medium sized marinas in San Joaquin County. Four are located in the Primary Zone and four are located in the Secondary Zone. The marinas in the Primary Zone are located on Empire Tract, King Island, Fabian Tract, in Stockton, and two on

Roberts Island. The medium sized marinas in the Secondary Zone are all located in Stockton. Medium marinas in San Joaquin County range from 50 to 175 berths.

Three medium sized marinas are located in Solano County; all three are located in the Primary Zone – one on Prospect Island and two on Ryer Island.

Two medium sized marinas are located in Yolo County, both in West Sacramento in the Secondary Zone.

There are a total of 4,866 berths in the 44 medium marinas: 1,939 in the Primary Zone; 2,614 in the Secondary Zone; and 313 outside the Legal Delta.

Large Marinas: Over 200 Berths

The inventory includes 18 large marinas; six in the Primary Zone, ten in the Secondary Zone, and two outside the Legal Delta. Of the large sized marinas, three are public marinas: Sacramento Marina, Antioch Marina, and Pittsburg Marina. The large marinas are fairly equally distributed between Contra Costa (six), San Joaquin (six), and Sacramento (five) Counties. One large marina is located in Solano County.

Of the six marinas in Contra Costa County, all are located in the Secondary Zone in Antioch, Oakley, Hotchkiss Tract, Bethel Island, and Discovery Bay. The large marinas in Contra Costa County range in size from 203 to 650 berths.

Of the six large marinas in San Joaquin County, three are located in the Primary Zone and the other three are located in the Secondary Zone. The three large facilities in the Primary Zone are located on King Island, Lower Roberts Island, and Terminous Tract. All three large facilities in the Secondary Zone are located within the City of Stockton. The large facilities in San Joaquin County range from 240 to 700 berths. The 700-berth Village West Marina, located in Stockton, is the largest marina in the Delta.

The five large marinas in Sacramento County range in size from 212 to 547 berths. Three large marinas are located in the Primary Zone, all on Andrus Island. One large marina is located in the Secondary Zone in Isleton. One large marina, the Sacramento Marina, is located outside the Legal Delta in the City of Sacramento.

There is one large marina in Solano County, the Delta Marina Yacht Harbor in Rio Vista just outside the Legal Delta.

There are a total of 6,042 berths in the 18 large marinas: 1,696 in the Primary Zone; 3,524 in the Secondary Zone; and 822 outside the Legal Delta.

Pump Outs

Some marinas provide pump-outs to be used to empty holding tanks containing wastewater from larger vessels. Most of the boats used in the Delta are smaller vessels that do not have holding tanks. The number of pumpouts in the Delta is about the same in 2005 as it was when the inventory was first completed in 1997. Although a few

facilities have added pump-outs over the last few years, others have facilities that are currently inoperable, and operators indicate they don't have the funds to repair them.

In Solano County, pump-outs are located at Delta Marina Yacht Harbor, Hidden Harbor Marina (a private facility catering to sailboats), and Sandy Beach Park.

In Yolo County, pump-outs are located at the Sacramento Yacht Club and at Sherwood Harbor Marina.

In Sacramento County, pump-outs are located at Boathouse Marina, Cliff's Marina, Dagmar's Landing, Delta Bay Marina & RV Park, Eddo's Harbor & RV Park, Freeport Marina, Korth's Pirate Lair, Landing #63, Metro Marina, Oxbow Marina, Perry's Boat Harbor, Rancho Marina Resort, Riverbank Marina, Riverboat Marina, River View Marina, Sacramento Marina, Walnut Grove Marina, and Brannan Island State Recreation Area. Bruno's Island Yacht Harbor is in the process of installing a pump-out facility.

In Contra Costa County, pump-outs are located at New Anchor Marina, Antioch Marina, Bethel Island Marina, Discovery Bay Yacht Harbor, Holland Riverside Marina, Lauritzen Yacht Harbor, Mazikeen's Landing, New Bridge Marina, Pittsburg Marina, Russo's Marina, Lindquist Landing, Sugar Barge Marina, and Willowest Marina.

In San Joaquin County, pump-outs are located at Herman & Helen's, Holiday Harbor Marina, King Island Resort, New Hope Landing, Paradise Point Marina, Tiki Lagoon, Tower Park Marina, Village West Marina, and Whiskey Slough Harbor.

There has not been any change in the availability of pumpouts in the Delta since 1997. Although a few private facilities have added pumpouts to their facilities, just as many facilities have pumpouts that are no longer operational or no longer available to the public.

Trails and Paths

There are trails and paths in the Delta, however, most of the trails and paths are in the Secondary Zone. The trails are either within a park or wildlife area, or along a shoreline in an urban area in the Secondary Zone, or out of the Legal Delta. All the trails and paths described here are public facilities, although some private marinas also have trails within their property.

There has been somewhat of an increase in the availability of trails in the Delta since 1997. Most new trails are associated with the expansion of public facilities in the Delta area, although properties owned by non-profit organizations have also expanded their own trails or opened new trail areas to public use. Some changes of note include the construction of community docks and pedestrian promenades in West Sacramento, Sacramento, Antioch, Stockton, Isleton, and Walnut Grove. Trail expansions have occurred at the Jepson Prairie Preserve, Cosumnes River Preserve, and Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area. East Bay Regional Parks District is in the process of constructing a new park at Big Break, which will include hiking trails and other amenities.

In Yolo County, a wildlife observation trail is included in the Yolo Bypass Wildlife Area. Also, the City of West Sacramento has constructed a pedestrian promenade along the west side of the Sacramento River.

In Solano County, the public fishing and access sites in the City of Rio Vista include shoreline trails/paths. There are also some trails at Solano County's Sandy Beach Park. In addition, within the Jepson Prairie Preserve, there is a self-guided, loop wildlife observation trail.

In Sacramento County, all of the public parks and recreational areas include trails and paths. In addition, the City of Sacramento approved a master plan that will result in a continuous trail/path access along much of the Sacramento River and the American River. There are trails within Brannan Island State Recreation Area. The Delta Meadows River Park has a trail along the old railroad right-of-way. The Cosumnes Preserve has nature observation trails. Those trails are available, free, at any time.

In Contra Costa County, the Antioch Marina, the Barbara Price Marina Park and the Riverfront Promenade provide shoreline paths. The Pittsburg Marina also includes a waterfront path. In addition, East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD) has constructed Marsh Creek Trail which links the Contra Costa County northern shoreline to southern areas of the County and a small trail near the eastern edge of Big Break. EBRPD also provides trails at its Antioch/Oakley Regional Shoreline. EBRPD has plans to construct trails throughout the County linking to other regional trails.

The White Slough Wildlife Area in San Joaquin County has a trail for hiking and to provide fishing and hunting access; the Woodbridge Ecological Reserve also has a trail. In the Secondary Zone, the City of Stockton has constructed a number of parks adjacent to levees along the Deep Water Channel and other waterways. These parks include paths atop the levees to provide views and access for fishing. The City has also constructed a bike and jog path along the Calaveras River.

Windsurfing Access Sites

The Sacramento River between Rio Vista and the tip of Sherman Island is well known as one of the best windsurfing areas in the world. Windsurfing is a seasonal sport; windsurfers surf when the weather is warm and the winds blow. The inventory identifies nine windsurfing access sites in Sacramento County and one in Solano County. Many of these sites are informal access areas, known to the windsurfers, but without improvements or support facilities. Windsurfers also access the water from Sandy Beach Regional Park, Cliffhouse Fishing Access, Delta Windsurf Company, Windy Cove at Brannan Island State Recreation Area, and the Sherman Island Fishing Access. In addition, like fishermen, many windsurfers park alongside the public roads, particularly Highway 160 and Sherman Island Road, to gain access to the Sacramento River waters.

The Delta Boating Needs Assessment cited concerns among windsurfers over the lack of water-access ramps by which they can access the waterways with their surfboards, campgrounds, food and services, restrooms, and parking areas.

Wineries

The Delta area has experienced some growth in the creation of wineries since the original inventory was completed in 1997; this is largely due to changes in zoning laws in some counties – namely Sacramento and San Joaquin – which now allow wineries as an existing use in agricultural zones (Yolo County already allowed wineries in agricultural zones in 1997). These changes to zoning laws have resulted in the planting of significant acreage of wine grapes in these counties, as well as the fruition of new wineries.

Several wineries exist in Yolo County, and are open to the public for wine tasting; most of these are located in the Clarksburg area. One of the biggest and most well-known is Bogle Vineyards & Winery; others include Ehrhardt Estates Winery, Clarksburg Wine Company LLC, and Wilson Vineyards.

Sacramento County also contains several wineries in the Delta area. Not all are open for wine tasting and tours, but they have websites where the public can purchase their products. Wineries in Primary Zone include Six Hands Winery and Gustafson Vineyards and Winery in the Walnut Grove area, and Scribner Bend Vineyards located south of Freeport.

San Joaquin County has only one winery in the Delta area: Benson Ferry Vineyards is located near the confluence of the Mokelumne and Cosumnes Rivers, in the Secondary Zone of the Delta.
